

**STATE OF MISSISSIPPI
DEPARTMENT OF REHABILITATION SERVICES
CONTRACT MODIFICATION I**

In addition to the terms and conditions set forth in the original Contract (20-351-0006-1046) between the Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services and The Arc of Mississippi, effective July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2020, the following Modification is made part of the original agreement:

Effective July 1, 2020, both parties agree to enact the option to renew the Contract for an additional twelve (12) month period. The election of the optional renewal shall extend the end date of this agreement to June 30, 2021.

Effective July 1, 2020, both parties agree that, while the rate of compensation shall remain as stated in the original Contract, the limit of the total allowable compensation shall be increased permitting the Contractor to be compensated an amount up to, but no more than, One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) for services rendered. It is expressly understood and agreed that in no event will the total compensation to be paid hereunder exceed the specified amount of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) for two years of service.

Indemnification. To the fullest extent allowed by law, Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless, protect, and exonerate the agency, its commissioners, board members, officers, employees, agents, and representatives, and the State of Mississippi from and against all claims, demands, liabilities, suits, actions, damages, losses, and costs of every kind and nature whatsoever including, without limitation, court costs, investigative fees and expenses, and attorney's fees, arising out of or caused by Contractor and/or its partners, principals, agents, employees and/or subcontractors in the performance of or failure to perform this agreement. In the State's sole discretion upon approval of the Office of the Mississippi Attorney General, Contractor may be allowed to control the defense of any such claims, suits, etc. In the event Contractor defends said claims, suits, etc., Contractor shall use legal counsel acceptable to the Office of the Mississippi Attorney General. Contractor shall be solely responsible for all costs and/or expenses associated with such defense, and the State shall be entitled to participate in said defense. Contractor shall not settle any claims, suits, etc. without the concurrence of the Office of the Mississippi Attorney General, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Entire Agreement. The Contract consists of the original agreement with incorporated exhibits and any modifications thereto. Any ambiguities, conflicts or questions of interpretations of this Contract shall be resolved by first reference to this agreement with incorporated exhibits and its modifications in order of effective date. Omission of any term or obligation from this agreement, modifications, or incorporated attachments shall not be deemed an omission from this Contract if such term or obligation is provided for elsewhere in this Contract.

All other terms and conditions of the original agreement not in conflict with this modification shall remain in full force and effect.
