## Central venous catheter

Thin catheter that goes into a large vein, used to monitor blood pressure, give drugs and fluids, and to give blood transfusions.



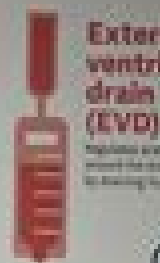
## Breathing tubes

These tubes are inserted into the mouth and connected to a machine that breathes for the patient. The tubes are called:



## Feeding pump

Used to deliver food and fluids to the patient through a tube in the nose to provide the nutrients needed for healing.



## External ventricular drain (EVD)

Regulates pressure around the brain to prevent swelling.

## Intracranial pressure (ICP) monitoring

A tube is inserted through the skull to measure brain pressure.



## Ventilator

Machine that breathes for the patient and helps to control breathing.



## High flow oxygen therapy

Delivers oxygen and air to the patient through a nasal cannula.

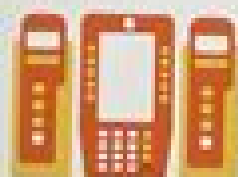


## Blood gas machine

Machine that tests blood samples to check the levels of oxygen, carbon dioxide, and pH.

## Infusion pumps

Delivers fluids and drugs into the vein, such as antibiotics, pain relief and sedatives.



## Arterial line

Thin tube inserted into a small artery to monitor blood pressure and take blood samples.



## Cough assist machine

Used to help the patient cough to clear the lungs.



## Suction machine

Used to remove secretions from the airway.



## Nitric oxide delivery device

Delivers nitric oxide to the patient to help with breathing.



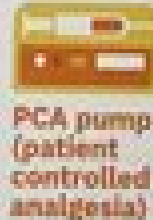
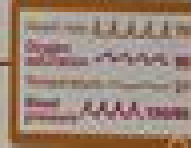
## Bronchoscopy

Used to look at the lungs and take samples.



## Bedside monitor

Monitors vital signs and other data.



## PCA pump (patient controlled analgesia)

Delivers pain relief on demand.



## Epidural

Used to deliver pain relief.

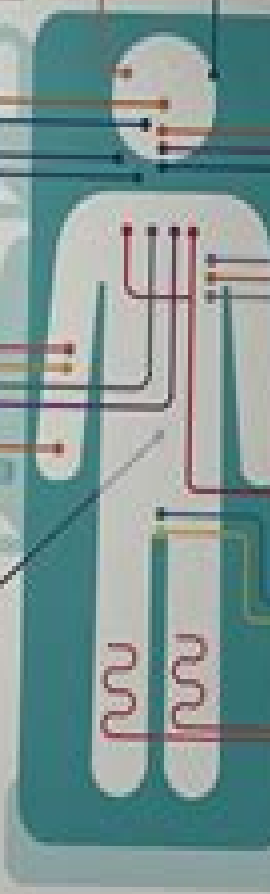
## Patient record

Used to prevent blood clots.

Used to filter the blood.



## Patient cooling device

Used to lower body temperature.

## External pacemaker

Used to regulate heart rate.



## Ultrasound

Used to see inside the body.



## Sounds

Used to monitor breathing.



## Extracorporeal membrane oxygenation

Used to provide oxygen to the blood.
